Master of Public Administration (MPA)

ECU's 42-credit MPA program is designed for pre-service and in-service students looking to start or advance their careers in government and nonprofit sectors.

PROGRAM ADMISSION

The MPA program admits students in fall, spring, and summer semesters. ECU Graduate School application deadlines are August 1, December 15, and May 1, respectively. Applicants should submit or satisfy the following:

- ECU Graduate School application and application fee
- Resume
- Statement of purpose describing professional goals
- Official transcripts demonstrating a minimum 2.7 undergraduate GPA
- Three letters of recommendation

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

MPA students complete a total of 14 courses (42 credits) in a mix of core and elective courses. Eight core courses and five electives are required. Pre-service students complete a 300-hour internship. In-service students may be eligible for an internship waiver. Full-time students typically complete the program in two years.
